Child-Porn-Sniffing Canines!

We all know that dog noses can do amazing things, from locating lost children to alerting diabetics of low blood sugar. Dogs can also help the police to sniff out evidence against child pornographers!

How can this be?

In 2011 Jack Hubbell, Ph.D., a chemist at the Connecticut Scientific Sciences Forensic Laboratory, discovered that electronic storage devices (ESDs) carry unique scents in their circuit board components that dogs can detect. Illicit images are usually saved on ESDs because they are small and easy to hide, and they can be sniffed out by trained ESD Detection Dogs (ESD K9s).

After being trained to detect these unique scents, in 2015 Bear, a black Lab, detected a thumb drive with pornographic images in the home of Jared Fogel that helped send Fogle to jail. Thoreau, a yellow Lab working for the Rhode Island State Police, found a thumb drive containing child pornographic images in a tin box inside a cabinet on his very first search. Selma, a black Lab working for the Connecticut State Police, discovered devices in recycling bins, vents, and radiators. Today there are many such ESD K9s effectively assisting law enforcement across the country.

Like other detection dogs, dogs chosen for ESD K9 training need to be high-energy dogs with a strong work drive, and strongly toy- or food-motivated. These are often dogs that have failed their training as assistance dogs for people with special needs because they are too high-energy or too reactive, but their high energy might make them very suitable for ESD K9 training.

Jack Hubbell, the fellow who got the ball rolling in this field, says that dogs can detect ESD odors at the parts-per-billion level and dogs consistently out-perform any mechanized odor-detection devices. How wonderful that our amazing best friends can help us root out the scourge of child pornography! Check out the complete article in the **Whole Dog Journal** from March 2020.
